**Supporting people who have experienced or are experiencing domestic abuse to a life beyond crisis**

- **Ealing Domestic Abuse Floating Support Service**

Free service supporting women aged 18+ who are experiencing domestic abuse

- **Ealing Domestic Abuse Complex Needs IDVA Support Service**

A free service supporting women and men aged 18+, living in the boroughs of Ealing, Harrow or Slough, who are currently experiencing domestic abuse and have complex support needs. This includes the need for housing.

**Both services offer confidential and non-judgmental support in line with the service users' individual needs.**

The support includes:

- Safety planning
- Support with available legal options
- Support with housing options
- Exploring support options for substance misuse
- Support with looking into financial and welfare benefits
- Support to access counselling and other health services
- Support with accessing immigration advice
